## Summary

Date: March 2025

Description of Work: The introduction of a Traffic Regulation Order on Mill Road in Arundel, to prohibit motor caravans from parking between 10pm and 9am every day. This restriction applies to all unrestricted parking places along Mill Road, between Arundel Museum and WWT Wildfowl Wetlands Trust.

Extent: Mill Road, Arundel

## Frequently Asked Questions

Q. Why does this work have to take place?

A. The work is being carried out following an application by the Arundel Town Council to implement parking restrictions that prohibit motor caravans from parking between 10pm and 9am on any day.

Q. What work has to be done?

A. To install the necessary traffic signs to introduce the above parking restrictions. The works will involve erecting nineteen sign plates on black posts work on the unrestricted sections between the existing double yellow line marking.

The scheme also includes low level vegetation clearance and siding to allow the existing double yellow markings to be refreshed. The installation of new cleft oak fencing at the back of the lay by adjacent to WWT Wildfowl Wetlands Trust, to protect the signposts as vehicle reverse into this parking area.

Q. What will the benefits be once it is finished?

A. The new parking restriction will allow motor caravans to visit the area during the day without any restrictions. However, Mill Road is not a suitable location for long duration stays, due to concerns such as environment impact caused by the lack of proper sanitary facilities, as well as the use of fire pits and barbeques on the grass verge.

Q. Will any roads have to be closed during the works?

A. No Mill Road should remain open throughout the works.

Q. What time of day will the work take place?

A. Hours of work will generally be between 07.30am and 17.30pm Monday-Friday. Before the works start, the appointed contractor will erect advance warning signs in the local area, letting you know any changes to the start date and marking the extent of the works.

Q. What disruption can pedestrians expect?

A. Pedestrian routes will be maintained wherever possible, but there may be short periods of diversion, if any problem please speak with the site foreman who will be happy to help.

Q. Will any diversion routes for traffic have to be put in place?

A. No diversions will be put in place to undertake these works.

Q. Could weather impact the proposed works?

A. Weather conditions can have an impact on the delivery of the works; however, this will be assessed and actioned closer to construction.
